

## **Medical Requirements**

With the advent of the Single European Sky air traffic controllers will be able to work across their country's borders, a greater mobility for all workers being one of Europe's main objectives.

To guarantee this mobility the requirements for air traffic controllers must be (close to) equal in all Member States.

Eurocontrol, the European Organisation for the Safety of Air Navigation that drafts the implementing rules for the Single European Sky, has published a document called: "[Requirements for European Class 3 Medical Certification of Air Traffic Controllers](#)".

This document determines the guidelines for the national ANSPs and has been implemented in Belgian national legislation through the adoption of a Ministerial Order of 14 July 2008 (only available in [French](#) or [Dutch](#)).

As a future potential air traffic controller you must meet the requirements set in the aforementioned Ministerial Order. Therefore a medical examination is part of the exam procedure.

Since the medical requirements for air traffic controllers are very strict, we advise you to carefully read the document below before enrolling.

Blood, blood pressure, lung capacity, nose-ear-throat, hearing, eye sight, etc. will be tested. You may want to contact your own GP if you have any doubts about qualifying for this medical exam.
